Växjö Katedralskola provides a full-time learning environment for upper secondary school students aged 16 to 19. Our talented young people learn to realise their potential, to develop the academic and extra-curricular opportunities provided by their creative gifts, and to become fully coping young adults in a changing world.

Växjö Cathedral School was established in 1643, on an earlier school founded in 1340. Växjö is an education hub in the south of Sweden, and the school has established academic partnerships with other secondary schools in Europe, and with Linnaeus University in Växjö. This upper secondary school features aesthetics, social and experimental sciences, economics, and humanities courses in the Swedish National Curriculum, as well as the International Baccalaureate Diploma. Many faculty hold post-graduate qualifications and receive national teaching prizes, and the students are motivated and awarded prizes in the sciences, arts, and mathematics. Our IBDP graduates are accepted into universities in Scandinavia, China, South Korea, the U.S., Australia, Japan, Canada, the U.K., the Netherlands, and other European countries. The IB Diploma develops critical thinking and intellectual reasoning and is considered highly attractive by universities worldwide.

We encourage an atmosphere of learning that ensures high academic standards, the
development of lifelong skills, and a sense of shared humanity that gives our students
the ability to think and act both locally and globally.

Our students also experience this mission statement in real terms with CAS projects in Sweden and overseas, such as a CAS project with micro banking in India and one working with the conservation of pandas in China.

The principles underlying our educational aims are:

- ⊃ the provision of full equality of learning opportunity regardless of race, gender, physical or other disability, faith or political affiliation, sexual inclination or social background;
- ⊃ the provision of an excellent quality of teaching and learning experience;
- ⊃ the provision of full pastoral care and inclusive arrangements to support all students;
- ⊃ the provision of a stimulating student community with a packed calendar of concerts, theatre, dance, sports, Student Council, and other events; and
- ⊃ the provision of a well-maintained environment conducive to learning.

The IB Diploma Programme is a three-year programme in our municipal school. The Preparatory Diploma Programme (PreDP) year aligns with the three-year secondary school parameters outlined by the Swedish School Law. Students take all subjects in English, excepting languages that can include Italian and Japanese, before taking the IB Diploma in their second and third years. Literature A languages other than English and Swedish that we have supported include: Albanian, Amharic, Arabic, Bosnian, Bulgarian, Chinese, Croatian, Danish, Dutch, French, Finnish, German, Hindi, Hungarian, Kurdish (request), Lithuanian, Norwegian, Persian, Polish, Portuguese, Romanian, Russian, Spanish, Somali (request), Swahili, Telugu (request), Turkish, and Urdu.



Year 1/Pre-Diploma: Students study (in English) English 5, Geography 1, History 1b, Modern Language (French, German, Italian, Japanese, or Spanish), Mathematics 1c, Science 1b, Sports & Health 1, and Swedish 1/SvAo1 (if students have grades from Year 9). Students intending to take more experimental sciences and more advanced Mathematics in the DP are encouraged to attend

lessons in Preparatory Chemistry, Preparatory Physics, and more advanced Mathematics. Students continuing with the modern language of French, German or Spanish that they previously studied accrue university credit points. These grades in Year 10 are required for all university applications in Sweden and overseas and comprise final grades from Year 10.

Years 2+3: The IB Diploma offers academic depth and breadth in a minimum of six subjects, three taken at higher level and three taken at standard level, from the six groups:

- 1 Studies in Language and Literature A: English A, SSST Literature A, Swedish A
- 2 Language Acquisition B: English B, German B, Spanish B, Swedish B, Swedish B ab initio
- 3 Individuals and Societies: Geography, Global Politics, Psychology
- 4 Experimental Sciences: Biology, Chemistry, Physics
- 5 Mathematics: Maths A&I SL, Maths A&A SL, Maths A&A HL
- 6 Arts or Electives: Theatre or another subject from groups 2-4

The core of the two-year Diploma is the CAS course of Creativity, Activity, and Service, an Extended Essay, and the Theory of Knowledge course.
